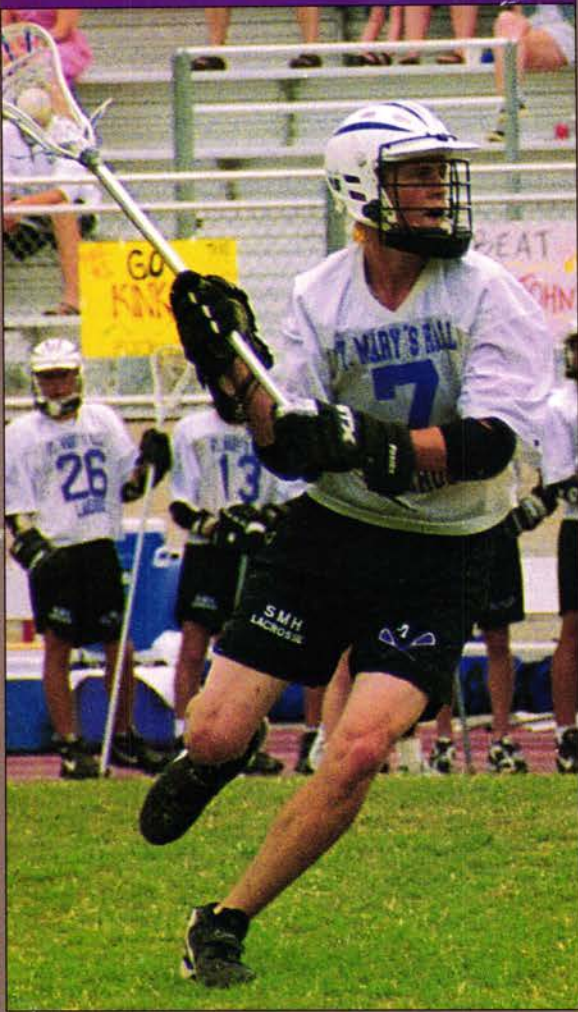



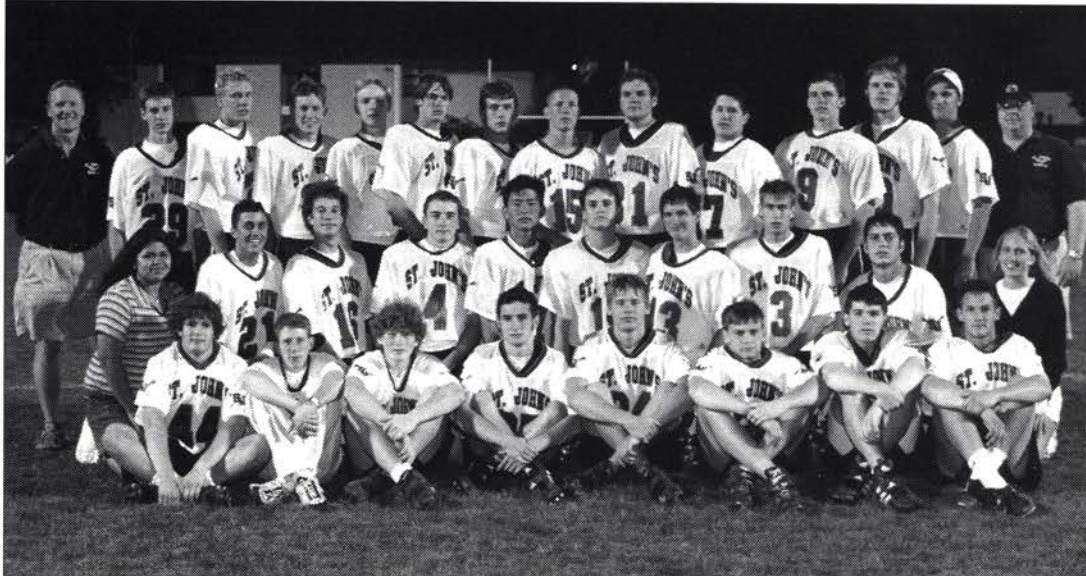

The St. John's Lacrosse program has set corner stones for each decade, beginning in 1956 and into the '60's when a lacrosse club was founded by present PE coach, Doug Osburn and other former East Coast faculty members. Football helmets were fitted with face masks and wooden sticks were supplied. In the late '70's, St. John's was one of the host sites for a SWLA-Club Division match-up with

a national touring team from Australia. Since St. John's formed the first sustained high school team in 1987, the program has evolved to varsity status and includes both 7th and 8th grade teams, Junior Varsity, and a complimentary girls program. St. John's was the site of the first lacrosse camp in Houston in 1993, the first youth game in Texas in 1995, ...continued on page 27.

The level of competition in the Men's North District continued to rise in the 2000 season, as the youth of teams in the past has matured. Many of or players are the product of the youth leagues and the heightened level of skills and athleticism are pervasive.

In 1999, Highland Park just missed the playoffs. But this year, the players and the coaches rose to the occasion and won the Red Division for the first time. Led by All-State Midfielder Ben Compton and All-State Defenseman Shaun Lorraine, they were undefeated in division and their only district loss was to Plano, 6-5, in the season opener. One of the most exciting games was Highland Park's 12-7 victory over Jesuit, which was the latter's first district loss since 1994. Highland Park held off a late charge by St. Mark's in its -6 victory.

Jesuit was once again an offensive power lead by All-State Attackmen, Tom and Craig Noland, and midfielder Nick Pauleit. Jesuit and Plano experienced a 16-14 barn-burner early in April.

Despite graduation losses from its 1999 team, Mike Crimmins coached Coppell to another playoff season, led by All-Stater Anthony Crimmins and goalie David Alter. The Greenhill School con-

tinued to improve under coach Christopher Hartley and the solid play of goalie LaNon Gillins. PESH and Loyola were at the short end of many lop-sided scores, but their skills and enthusiasm are improved.

The Blue Division once again came down to the Plano and St. Mark's game at the end of the season, which Plano won; 11-5. However, formidable efforts were made by ESD, Berkner and Hillcrest to upend them. ESD rose up out of those three teams to gain the third playoff seed from the Blue Division. St. Mark's and ESD has two of the youngest rosters in the league. Coach Thomson's Lions were sound defensively and lead by two-time All-State Defenseman James Winston, who was one of the best take-away defenders in the district. Known more as a transition offensive team, St. Mark's featured All-State Midfielder Jake Wagner and All-District Attackman Brian Powell. By far ESD improved more than any other team under the tutelage of new Coach Heyward Lee. His straight-talking, no nonsense style created an organized and disciplined defensive team whose offense progressed throughout the season. The Eagles challenged Jesuit well in their first-round playoff game, falling 12-9. Berkner and Hillcrest had successful seasons and shared one of the district's more exciting games of the season. Berkner also took Plano and St. Mark's down to

the wire. Hillcrest fielded it's largest team ever and some of that inexperience showed on defense. Caddo Magnet displayed improvement under new Coach Tim Weisman, and with the creation of a youth program in Shreveport, everyone hopes to see continued stride by both Caddo and Loyola.

Overall, our district is healthy, the level of competition is strong and more boys are interested in lacrosse than ever before.

Jesuit squared off with Highland Park in the North District Championships, seeking revenge for their only loss of the season. Highland Park took an early lead, but three goals in a span of one minute and fifty seconds gave Jesuit a 6-4 halftime lead. Highland Park battled back to tie the game at 9 all. Jesuit scored late and iced the game with one second left on the clock to win 11-9. The Ranger's defense, and freshman goalie Michael Galvin, played its best game of the year. Tom Noland had two goals and four assist, while his brother Craig tallied another two goals for the Rangers. Teal Griffeth had five goals in the losing effort for the Highland Park Scots.

three new teams and a significant change in the competitive format. New at the varsity level in 2000 were the Ft. Bend County Lacrosse Club and Clear Lake High School. The biggest change in Houston was the move to divisional play during the regular season with separate schedules and separate division championship tournaments. Each

division featured a home-and-away format for each of the five opponent. The ten game schedule led to post-season tournament play that included the four top finishers in each division. The rationale for the change was to provide a fully competitive schedule for each team in each division, and to ensure that every division game of the schedule was a meaningful contest that had a bearing on potential post-season matchups.

With the final games results in...it is clear that the division format was a huge success. Virtually every game was a competitive 'war', and there were a host of close games in each division. Several traditional school rivalries were further reinforced by a split in their season's series. St. John's and Lamar ended the spring tied in Division 1 with identical 7-3 records. Every other team; The Woodlands, Kinkaid, Kingwood and Episcopal, were all 4-6.

That's competitive balance.

In Division 2, Bellaire dominated with a 10-0 record, followed by the Fort Bend Lacrosse Club (7-3), Clear Lake (5-5), Cy-Fair (4-6), Klein (2-7) and Memorial (0-9).

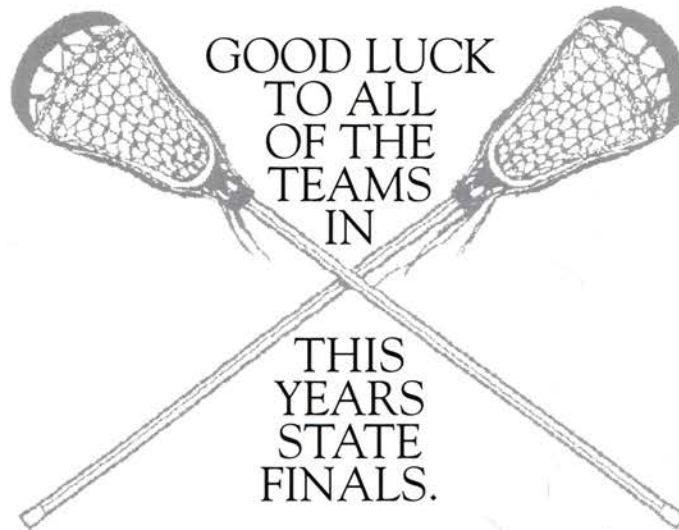

In 1987, the St. John's School of Houston established the first continuous men's scholastic lacrosse program, under the guidance of Randy Bryant of Houston and organized by Matt Harder, a former player at the University of Texas.

The following year, two additional teams emerged in the Bayou City; Memorial High School and Lamar High School. Memorial and St. John's competed for the first 'state' championship.

By 1989, teams were established in Austin (Westlake HS) and Dallas (Dallas Jesuit). The Texas High School Lacrosse League was founded with Randy Bryant as the first Commissioner of statewide scholastic lacrosse.

The determination was made during the next season to rotate the location of the State Championship Event from Houston to Austin to Dallas, in order to help promote the development of new programs in these regions.

In 1996, the current four-team playoff format was initiated with three regional representatives and a fourth at-large or wild-card bid.

1998 was highlighted by the inauguration of the Women's Division of the Texas High School Lacrosse League and their first State Champion; The St. John's Rebels.

Collecting this statistical data is a 'work-in-progress' for the THSLL.

Many of the scores and records displayed here have been adapted from files, articles, and memory. The ideal circumstances would be to access the scorebooks of these events to document precise records. Should any of our readers have detailed records, old scorebooks or any source of information, we will gratefully correct any error or omission which occur here.

One of the more challenging dimensions of developing these records is the individual statistics from tournament play. Acquiring this research is a fairly tedious process, and again—any additions or corrections to these ongoing records would be greatly appreciated.

National Honors and Recognition

Since the mid-fifties an organization called NILA—the National Interscholastic Lacrosse Association, and the former Lacrosse Foundation, sponsored national recognition for high school athletes through the honorary selection process of scholastic All-Americans, Academic All-Americans and the promotion of a scholastic North Vs. South All-Star Game.

In 1994, the Texas High School Lacrosse League had grown large enough to achieve recognition from this organization as a contributing state-wide association. The THSLL was granted participation in the afore-mentioned categories. In 1998, NILA merged with US lacrosse, Inc., the national governing body for the sport of lacrosse, under the authority of the US Lacrosse Coaches Council.

To date, there is not a corresponding national awards organization for Women's Lacrosse.

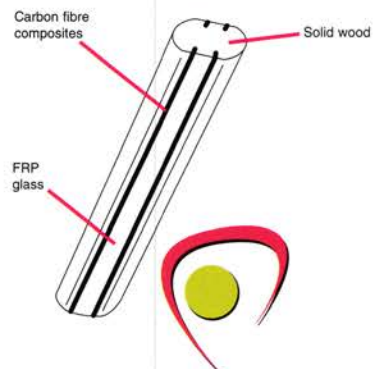

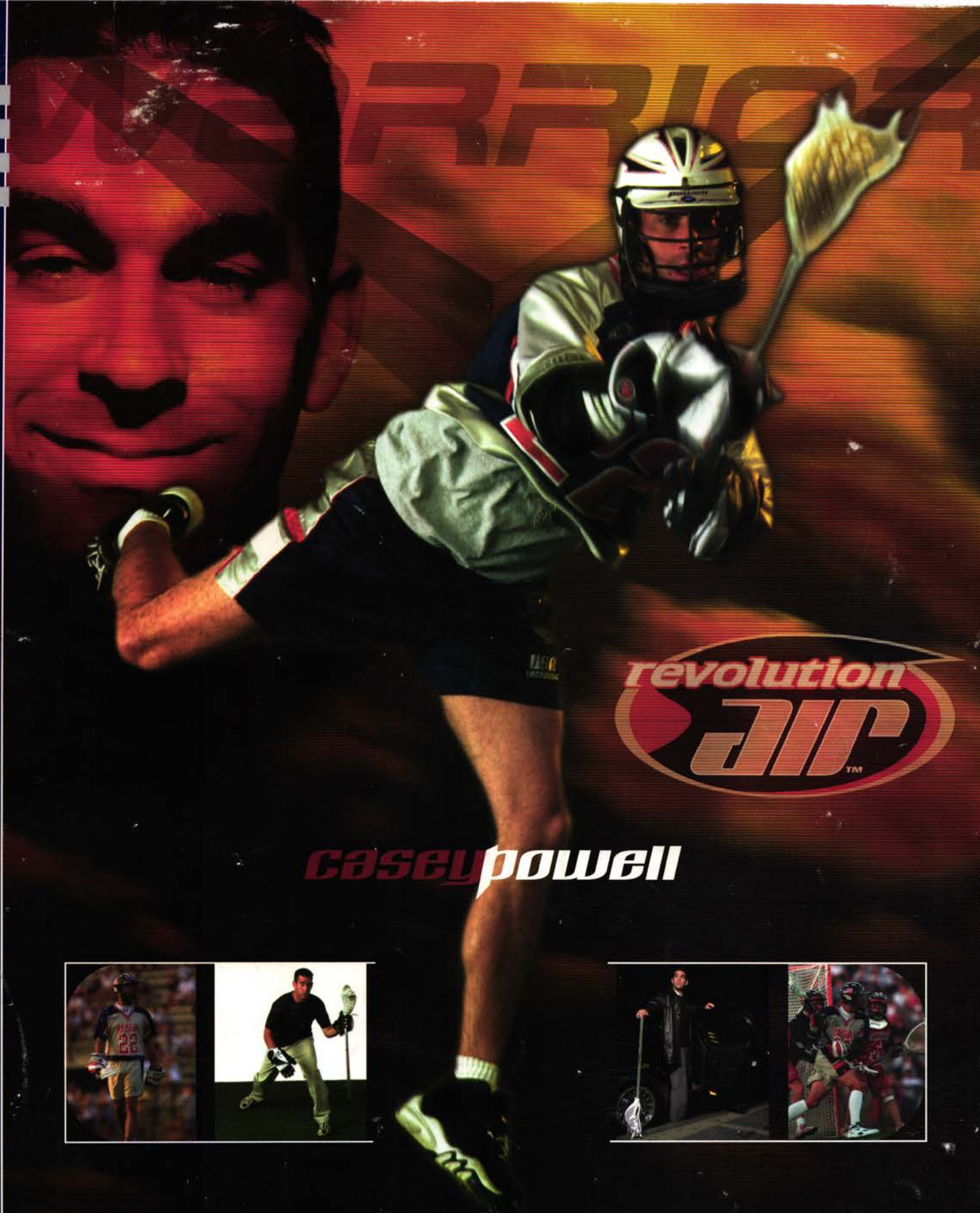

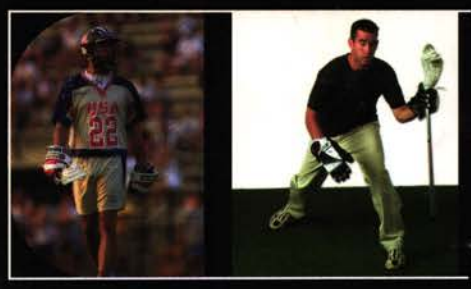
