IT'S A WONDERFUL DAY FOR LACROSSE

Women's North District

Congratulations to The Hockaday School for capturing the North District Championship and Good Luck in the State-Play-offs!

In the semifinals: Hockaday defeated ESD (Episcopal School of Dallas) 17-6. While CE Byrd from Shreveport, LA defeated the Dragons from Southlake, TX 9-6.

In the finals Hockaday won a hard fought game against CE Byrd 15-3 to convincingly win the 2004 North District Championship. With these victories Hockaday gained a birth in the THSLL State championships, which will be held in Southlake while Byrd goes to the quarterfinals.

The North District maintained a total of eleven varsity teams this year but added several new and very promising JV teams. The new teams include Hillcrest, Ursaline and Highland Park. Several of these teams will be requesting spots in the varsity ranks for 2005 and based on their level of play, the coaching talent and the

number of young ladies that signed up they will be strong additions to the varsity ranks.

The year kicked off with the WIN clinic hosted by Patty Wick head coach Hockaday and Amy Sullivan head coach at Greenhill. They also had coaches from several East coast colleges join their coaching ranks. The turnout was overwhelming and the players benefited from the collective knowledge of these truly great coaches.

We tried something new this year when the officials had their annual clinic. All of the new JV teams had players present to help the official instructor illustrate actions that were or were not violations of the rules. This proved to be a big success and benefited both players and officials alike. The North District continued it's support of the statewide effort inter-district play by having several teams from both JV and varsity travel to other districts both in Texas and Louisiana. This was the first time all three districts established schedules early and shared them. Conflicts were avoided this helped teams schedule time to travel. Additionally, the new Quarter Final system for the State play-offs uses votes from all the districts with criteria that includes have

been "seen" in action around the system. The coaches voting can use these visiting games as guidelines when making decisions of who gets the forth and final invitation.

The regular season saw many astounding efforts at both JV and varsity levels. The regular season standings were determined after our first season of teams only playing each other in single game matchups. Our new system helped relieve some of the time demands for our players and coaches. Which, left time to schedule games and playdays in other districts without worry of conflicts.

We want to congratulate all of our players, coaches and officials for a GREAT season that made all of your time and hard work so enjoyable to watch!

We also want to wish all of our seniors the very best as they move on to many of the nations top universities. They will be representing all of us as the best Texas and Louisiana has to offer both academically and in lacrosse!

proposal by the Cy-Fair coach on the field at the end of their State Championship victory last May. The flair and grace of women's lacrosse put us in a position where we had a running start to a successful 2004 season.

Growth continues to be the by-word for Central District Women's Lacrosse. The district played this year with nine varsity teams, seven JV teams, a new beginning for the district and our first start-up team at the Texas Military Institute (TMI) in San Antonio. The youth program also expanded this year, so the players of tomorrow are starting into the pipeline.

The TMI effort now puts both the men and women into the San Antonio area. While this is a great step forward, it brings travel problems because of the 100 miles between some of the schools. TMI got to play several Central JV teams and the net effect was very positive.

The Central traveling team, the Austin Attack, played their first competition during the year. The outlook for the team is good and they look forward to more play in Texas and

beyond.

The season got off to a disastrous start with just about continuous rain the first week of the season. This caused significant schedule disruption, and coupled with an acute official shortage, proved a challenge to get the season accomplished. Our officials did a great job to provide coverage of the increased varsity and JV schedule.

The district play this year was highlighted by the undefeated regular season of St. Andrew's School. Our representative to the State Championship last year continued their district winning ways and also added three victories over South District SPC opponents. The Crusaders were honored by having two of their players being asked to join the Houston Vail Team.

Cedar Park, in only their second season, finished a strong second to St. Andrew's. This program has had an amazing rise to power in a very short period of time. The other two playoff teams are Austin High and Bowie. Both of these original Central programs have been successful for an extended

period of time. Westlake tied Austin and Bowie for third, but lost the tie-breaker for the playoffs.

The future continues to look bright for Central, but the black cloud continues to be the lack of coaches. Stability in the coaching ranks is our number one problem and significant effort is being expending to solve this and send our program to more lofty heights. Our teams, officials and coaches did a great job this year and the district is very proud of them!

Women's South District

Houston had an exciting spring of lacrosse. The season kicked off with St. John's Playday, which found 14 varsity teams enjoying a fun and informal day of lacrosse.

There were many close games and exciting finishes. Cy Fair was the only team to make it through the regular season with an unblemished record, followed by St. John's, whose only district loss came against Cy Fair. Memorial and Kinkaid rounded out the top four, followed by the Woodlands, Lamar, Episcopal, Clear Lake, Bellaire, Kingwood and Klein.

The fifth annual Houston JV Tournament was held in early April and featured sixteen squads from across the state. The Kingwood program put on a terrific tournament, which saw Bellaire outlast St. John's 9-8 to win the championship.

Middle school girls' lacrosse continues to flourish. This spring there were nine middle school programs, many of which had two teams. Their season was highlighted by a first-ever Houston middle school playday, hosted by Kinkaid in late April. It was a fun and rewarding day for all.

Off season tournaments and trips kept our players busy. Last summer several local players were on the Texas Team that competed in the National Tournament in Pennsylvania. For the fourth year, Houston had another successful team in the Vail Shootout. Our elite team, the Houston Heat, entered its third year, which was highlighted by a November trip to Washington DC for a tournament. A second travel team, GB Lax, was formed and also competed successfully in out-of-state tournaments.

The South district wishes best of luck to all of the teams in this year's State Tournament!

Men's North District

Highland Park has played the strongest schedule in the THSLL with perhaps the most injuries of any North District team during the regular season. There were ups and downs, but an 11-7 road victory against St. Marks in its regular season finale gives the talented Scots the #1 seed in the North District tournament pairings.

Close losses to Texas #1 ranked Episcopal School of Houston, Texas, reigning champion, Tennessee's reigning champion, Memphis University School, and always tough St. Johns of Houston were certainly season low points. Victories over Charlotte County Day, the North Carolina high school champion, Central District competition, plus district wins over Dallas Jesuit, Plano and St. Marks have buoyed the team's confidence. There is no shortage of talent and with the approach of the playoffs, the Scots will finally be healthy and ready.

St. Marks is the surprise of the 2004 North District regular season. First year coach, Hayward Lee, introduced a new

system of offense and defense to an extremely young team.

The Lions have responded well. Key victories during the year have included a spring trip win over St. Andrews, the reigning Florida State champion, decisive wins over Central District competition and a solid effort against Dallas Jesuit. Their 9-5 victory over defending Texas State Champion, ESD, has propelled them into their first ever appearance in the SPC finals.

Episcopal School of Dallas, defending Texas State Champion, has an overall 16-2 season, 5-1 North District record going into the playoffs. Only losses to St. Marks and Episcopal School of Houston have marred an extremely successful campaign under first year head coach Kevin Barnicle. A great spring trip to Florida netted the Eagles impressive wins over perennial eastern powers Avon Old Farms and Millbrook. They have been equally impressive versus Southern and Central District competition.

Plano has built an impressive 13-4 record, 3-3 in district, with first year coach Chris Braceland. With six sophomore starters, Plano

is another young, fast closing team. The spring highlights include a trip to North Carolina where Plano beat Riverside Durham, 13-4, Chapel Hill High School, 10-6 and East Chapel Hill High School. Late season district victories over Greenhill, Jesuit and Southlake and a change in goal have energized the program.

Dallas Jesuit has perennially turned up the pace after spring break. This year, Coach Matt Oelker's Rangers are a defensive team that continues to search for goal scoring. The 2004 Rangers are a team that sports large numbers, athletic talent and the defensive grit to win, while struggling to score many goals. One goal losses to Plano and St. Marks have hurt the cause. However, if past years are an indication, Jesuit will play their best games late in the season. They are a program with an excellent lacrosse tradition that wants to return to the State Championship.

Southlake has been a most welcome addition to North District Division

I competition. Despite being a team with only three seniors and six juniors, Coach David Smith's well coached, disciplined, 9-4 Dragons have been competitive in all but one district game. Intra-district wins over Westwood, Kinkaid and McCallum have highlighted the season. Southlake shows good ball movement, athletic ability and stick skills.

***Greenhill** is young and improved, but needs more players. Of the 28 man roster, over 65% of the squad is freshman and sophomores. They suffered during the season due to an Achilles injury to their best athlete and player Jeff Klein (junior, attack). Their young players are intelligent and coachable. Without a solid senior group they have been over-matched physically.*

The North District continues to grow and improve. The District Youth Programs are experiencing record numbers. There should be another team added to the North District Division I next year. There continues to be a need for officials and coaches. If you

Men's Central District

***Austin High** continues to be a force in The Central. Starting this year with a win at the UT Shootout, they upset business-as-usual with a district win over inter-city rival St. Mary's Hall. This gave them high seed in the ditrict playoffs. With 11 seniors on the squal, they expect that the development of feeder programs and the experience of their younger players will allow them to continue their current run*

***St. Mary's Hall** has felt the impact of the loss of some key players this year. Dealing with injuries, they tested some of their young players to step up and stay motivated. The Barons will be graduating nine seniors and will rely on these young players to lead them back to the glory years. They end the season as the #2 seed entering the playoffs. They are expected to make a strong showing in the playoffs and continue to be the team to beat in The Central.*

***Westwood** enjoyed*

another strong season. In a year where injuries forced lineup changes almost every game, the 2004 Warriors showed that they were a "never say die" team and go into the playoffs with #3 seed. While not a physically overpowering squad, the 2004 Warriors fashioned a fine record using a fast paced ball movement offense and strong defense. Westwood graduates 16 seniors this year but a set of strong younger players bode well for next season.

***McNeil** started the season strong by finishing second in their bracket at the Texas A&M Aggieland Classic. After a rash of player ineligibility during the middle six weeks of the season they finished strong with a #4 seed going into the playoffs. They proved to have a fine showing this year and are losing only two seniors so they should be a formidable club in 2005.*

***Central Catholic** had a much-improved season over 2003 and matched records with McNeil and McCallum in*

a 3-way tie for the fourth spot. They look for a strong class of seniors to lead the way to an even better season in 2005. They end this season as the #5 seed in the playoffs.

McCallum returning this year to Division I, has contended for the DII State Championship by representing The Central for the last two years. Jumping from the top of the DII rankings to the middle of the pack in DI is a big step for the Knights. They look forward to building on this success next year as they lose only 5 seniors and turn the reins over to a small junior class and a large sophomore class.

Westlake's middle school program, having experienced growing pains this year, the success has lead them to be the only Central District team to ever field two full JV squads. Although they will lose 14 seniors, the future may be very bright for the Chaparrals as they look forward to 11 returning juniors and an influx from the middle schools.

Men's South District Episcopal High School went undefeated this

season in District play. To prove a point, Episcopal traveled to Dallas twice, beating EDS (13-7) to start the season and then during spring break, defeated Highland Park (14-12) and Plano (18-10) in the same day. A late season game versus rival St. John's, with control of 1st place of the South District at stake, yielded a (15-5) victory. Defeating their opponents by an average of more than 10 goals per game, Episcopal had most games in control quickly this season. A notable end of the year exception was the Lamar game in a (10-11) thriller.

Lamar was no stranger to close games this season. Eight of their eleven games were decided by a difference of three goals or less including four one goal games. Lamar started the season by sweeping a pair of Central District teams Austin(9-8) and Westwood (8-6), but then fell to the Dallas Jesuit the following week (2-5). In District play, it was another prototypical Dave Vollmer Lamar team. Lamar dispatched South District foes efficiently, including an overtime with over Kinkaid(6-5) and victory over Clear Lake(7-5). Gaining

strength as the season progressed, Lamar was undefeated in district play before their match-up with Episcopal. Lamar played the Knights to a one goal game before narrowly losing 10-11. The close game theme held up in the St. John's game, as Lamar won a 7-6 match and gained them a second seed in the district playoffs.

St. John's started the season off strong, going undefeated in league play into their match-up with Episcopal. Sophomores Chris Root (All-State) at attack and Chris Gagel (All-State) at defense along fellow sophomores Deets Hoffman and John Crain contributed in a sweep of two games with North Division foes Highland Park (9-4) and St. Mark's (10-5). After a disappointing loss to Episcopal, St. John's defeated Kinkaid (8-6) then experienced another tough loss to Lamar (6-7). To add insult in injury (literally), St. John's also lost their starting senior All-District goalie David Atlas in their game with Lamar. However the season ends for the Rebel's, Head Coach Sam

Chambers will be blessed with some very talented and seasoned juniors for next year.

Kinkaid racked up a 5-4 season in league play and gaining a #4 seed in the District playoffs. Kinkaid advanced to the second round of playoffs with a 9-6 victory over fifth seed Strake Jesuit. Second year Head Coach Ryan Frost had his fair share of close games, including a tough 5-6 overtime loss to Lamar and a 9-8 win over Ponderosa (Colorado).

Strake Jesuit, after two consecutive seasons of winning the Division II State championships, Strake was definitely ready to be promoted to Division I this year holding their own in league play and gaining a #5 seed in the district playoffs in their first season including wins over long-time Division I residents Kingwood (12-6) and the Woodlands (6-4). For a second year in a row, Strake traveled to Washington D.C. for Jesuit tournament and including a game with a nationally ranked Georgetown Preparatory team. For next season, Coach Paul DiMarco will

benefit by the return of standout goalie John-Paul Cashiola, who was named the alternate goalie for the Team Texas under-17 team for 2004.

Success in Division I lacrosse in Texas is more and more Contingent on the quality of players arriving as freshman. We are blessed in the South district with highly talented and dedicated coaches who are strong advocates for their players. As good as our coaches are, the quality of coaching in the middle school ranks is becoming more critical with each passing season. Clear Lake, the Woodlands and Kingwood, all have programs to develop young players with an eye towards improving the quality of their players through quality coaching. Each year there is speculation as to where players trained by Mike Donnelly at River Oaks Baptist and Mike Block at Annunciation Orthodox will attend as freshman. As it was in the early days of Texas high school lacrosse, a shortage of quality coaches continues to influence the growth and direction of our sport.
