

Texas High School Lacrosse League



History

The Texas High School Lacrosse League (THSLL) (the "League"), though not named at the time, started with three high schools in Houston, Texas in 1987: Kinkaid, Memorial, and St. John's. The teams were started by three energetic student athletes from each school, all friends.

The first champion, St. John's, was crowned in 1988 in an unofficial tournament. Since that time, the sport of lacrosse in Texas has grown exponentially, fueled by other energetic young student athletes, coaches, administrators, and fans. The first official THSLL champion was Lamar, crowned by Randy Bryant the THSLL Commissioner, in 1989, after a hard fought victory over St. John's.

Overview

The THSLL is over 80 Member School Programs strong in 2012, and is home to 149 Varsity and JV Teams and over 3,700 high school student athletes across the State of Texas. The THSLL provides the environment for a positive experience and motivation for success – in lacrosse, the classroom, and in life beyond high school; helping build self-esteem and confidence; teaching teamwork and discipline; promoting pride and belonging, and offering an excellent avenue for exercise, competition, and recreation.

The Texas Scholastic Lacrosse Association, Inc. (TSLA) is the governing body for the THSLL. The THSLL is the membership association for boys' lacrosse (THSLL Member School Programs) at the high school level in Texas, defined as grades nine through twelve.

Guiding Principles

1. Creating a structured environment in which student athletes, coaches, administrators, and parents benefit from membership in an organization that facilitates the growth and rewards of playing lacrosse.
2. Promoting and protecting the health of participating student athletes by establishing uniform rules of play and cultivating the ideals of good sportsmanship, loyalty, and fair play.
3. Working in harmony with the inter-scholastic governing bodies of THSLL Member School Programs, and other concerned Texas constituencies.
4. Establishing and maintaining a process for continuous improvement of the League, by working with THSLL Member School Programs, and other concerned Texas constituencies.

Member Teams

Member Teams consist of Varsity and Junior Varsity Teams, and the League is divided into Districts and Divisions.

Division I is made up of Member School Programs that are more established lacrosse programs. DI teams have by-laws, procedures, a designated head coach and president, reasonable relations with their host school and/or city / community, and a JV and Varsity high school Teams which play a full back to back JV and Varsity schedule.

Division II is targeted at development of lacrosse programs. Division II Member School Programs generally have bylaws, procedures, a designated head coach and president, reasonable relations with their host school and/or city / community, and at least JV and Varsity high school Teams.

Division III is made up of new or relatively new lacrosse Teams, still working towards critical mass of players, coaches, funding, fields, administrative support and school / city / community support.

South Division I Recap

Houston Christian won the South District Division I Championship in 2012, but it wasn't easy. During the regular season, the Mustangs went undefeated including a 9-6 win over perennial south district favorite The Woodlands. In a late season matchup, Houston Christian narrowly avoided defeat in overtime against St. John's when a potentially game winning Maverick shot hit off the top pipe. A short time later however, Houston Christian attackman Bucky Desadier came around the back of the goal to score the winning goal, defeating St. John's 12-11. The same week, the Mustangs also received a scare when an Episcopal Houston fourth quarter rally fell short 12-11. Houston Christian played in several games against Central District foes in 2012 including victories over Alamo Heights 16-3, Anderson 9-8 and Austin 11-8, but fell to Westwood early in the season 5-6 and eventual Central District Champion Westlake 8-11 to bring their final regular season record to 15-2. Advancing to the Super Regional hosted on their home field, Houston Christian came back from a two goal deficit to power past Plano West in the second half to a 10-6 victory. After only their fifth year as a lacrosse team and their second year in Division I, coach Pete Lehle's win over Plano West advanced the Mustangs to the THSLL Championships in Georgetown, Texas. Houston Christian was led by All State attack players Bucky Desadier (also an All American) and Brooks Lehle, along with All State Goalie Malachy Lyon-Letts, All-State middle Connor Pryor, All District defenseman Hayden Sterling and All District midfielder Ivan Morris.

The Woodlands placed second in the South District going 15-1 overall and 9-1 in district with their lone loss at the hands of Houston Christian 6-9. The Woodland's played in a number of Inter-district games including defeating the eventual Central District Champion Westlake 11-9, Austin 19-3, Highland Park 8-6 and Southlake 9-7. Travelling to Dallas for Super Regional as a number 2 seed, The Woodlands season came to a disappointing end when they lost at the hands of Highland Park 8-10, a team they had previously beaten earlier in the year. The Woodlands gained All State Honors for Spencer Willey at attack, Ian Seal and Ben Lipscomb at midfield, Dylan Gorman on defense and face off specialist Jake Williams. Winning All District honors were Tyler Murphy at attack and Derek Koett at long stick middle.

Perhaps the most intriguing team this year was the St. John's Mavericks. St. John's started the season with five consecutive wins over St. Thomas 18-1, Cinco Ranch 10-1, pitched a shutout against St. Mary's Hall 20-0, defeated Kingwood 10-9 and Memorial 9-5 before falling to the Woodlands 13-9. St. John's also defeated Palo Verde (California) 10-6 and beat Strake Jesuit with second left on the clock for a 5-4 win. The Mavericks appeared to get stronger by winning their remaining games except a narrow loss to Houston Christian in overtime 11-12. In the District Playoffs, St. John's defeated a stubborn Kingwood team 11-6 to advance to the Super Regional in Dallas as the number 3 seed. At the Super Regional, St. John's easily defeated Anderson 12-5 and played the undefeated North Division I champion Dallas Jesuit even in third quarter before eventually falling 6-4. Winning All State honors were Ben Griffin on defense, Chris Gow at midfield, and Logan Smith at long stick middle. Winning All-District honors were Jack Craddock on defense, Douglas Berkman on attack, Jonathan Newar at midfield and Nate Whittle at goalie.

What Strake Jesuit lacked in offence, they made up on defense as Strake Jesuit ended the season 12-7 overall and 7-3 in district. All American, All-State and South District MVP Sam Finney anchored a defense that limited opponents to 4.8 goals per game during the regular season. In a tough loss against St. John's, the Crusaders played to a 4-4 tie with less than a minute to play when St. John's scored to defeat Strake Jesuit 4-5. Strake also had difficulty winning against the better teams losing to Houston Christian 6-10 and the Woodlands 5-9. Gaining the fourth seed in the district for the playoffs, Strake played number five seed Episcopal Houston to a 4-3 score at halftime but their normally stingy defense gave up a bunch of goals in the second half, and were defeated by Episcopal 5-13. Joining Mr. Finney at All State were goalie Clark Bullington and All District players John Cashin on defense and Jordan Underwood at midfield.

Episcopal Houston had an up and down year starting the season with losses to North District teams Coppell 4-12 and Dallas Jesuit 1-17. By the end of season however, the Knights improved to 6-4 in district games and gained the fifth seed in the playoffs to play Strake Jesuit in the South District playoffs. After playing Stake nearly even in the first half, Episcopal scored in quick succession in the second half to win 13-5 to advance the Knight's to the Houston super regional the following weekend. Facing St. Mark's from Dallas, the number two team from the North District, Episcopal fell behind and then pulled even several times before St. Marks scored a couple of goals in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter with a final score of EHS 7, St. Mark's 11. On attack, Episcopal Houston was led by All State and All American winner Max Skibber, who is headed to Yale in the fall. Also at All-State was midfielder Max Hutson along with All District Defenseman Steven Pitt and All District Face off player Anderson Clark.

Kingwood faced a rebuilding year for 2012 after losing their ENTIRE 2011 team to graduation. Kingwood achieved a 4-6 district record and a 7-9 record overall. Kingwood lost a number of close ball games, including against St. John's 9-10, Episcopal Houston also 9-10 and The Woodlands 10-11. Kingwood finished the season in a three way tie with Memorial and Kinkaid with identical district records of 4-6, but won the sixth seed and the last playoff spot for the district playoffs. In a rematch against St. John's, Kingwood was behind 5-4 late in the third quarter when St. John's starting finding their shot, eliminating Kingwood from the playoffs in a 6-11 loss. Winning All District honors for 2012 were Brett Wilms at attack and Ethan Medler at midfield.

Going into the final game of the season, Memorial had a chance to go to the district playoffs for the first time in Division I if they could beat Kinkaid. On a rainy night, Memorial and Kinkaid both had difficulty scoring with the game was tied at the end of regulation 4-4. Kinkaid finally prevailed after scoring a goal in the second overtime period to win 5-4. Memorial, Kinkaid and Kingwood all concluded the 2012 season with identical 4-6 records, but by virtue of a goal differential tie breaker, Kingwood earned the sixth seed, Memorial the seventh seed and Kinkaid the eighth seed. At All-State for Kinkaid was defenseman Henry Waite and All District attackman Wilson Jeckocich and midfielder Andrew Campbell.

Lamar, St. Thomas and Cinco Ranch struggled this season all finishing the season with 1-9 district records. One bright spot for Lamar was the awarding of All District honors to goalie Raleigh Shepherd from the South Division I coaches.

Due to the huge growth of lacrosse in Houston, programs at the youth, middle school and high school level need parents of today's player to be active and volunteer their time to improve the quality of the game in Texas for future players. 



For Dallas Jesuit, the 2012 North District DI Champions, St. Mark's, Plano West, and Highland Park, the hard work and sacrifices paid off, and resulted in their earning their right to play in the DI North and South Super Regionals. While Plano West lost a heartbreaker to Houston Christian, Dallas Jesuit, St. Mark's and Highland Park won their Super Regional games, and the right to move on to Georgetown for the 2012 THSLL State Championship Weekend. They will all suit up Saturday, May 5th for their semifinal games to compete for two coveted spots in the 2012 THSLL DI State Championship game on Sunday, May 6th.

Can you say great coaching, and great individual and Team play for the entire 2012 THSLL Season?! Dallas Jesuit also had a big 2012 win over Fordham Prep (NY), and its only loss for 2012 came in a 7-6 nail biter to St. Ignatius (San Francisco, CA.) Dallas Jesuit won their hard fought DI North Super Regional game against St. John's, and earned their place in the 2012 State Championship Weekend.

Outstanding Team and individual performances resulted in four All-State Honors for Dallas Jesuit players – Zach Coker (#25 – 2013) All-State Attack, Garrett Van De Ven (#15 – 2013) All-State Midfield, Michael McCamey (#31 – 2012) All-State Defense, and Dan Morris (#8 – 2013) All-State 1st Team Goalie, and six All-District Honors for Dallas Jesuit players – Jason Myer (#11 – 2014) All-District Attack, Carson Buell (#7 – 2013) All-District Midfield, Lee Belland (#0 – 2014) All-District Midfield, Alex Petsos (#9 – 2012) All-District FOGO, Hunter Hill (#28 – 2013) All-District Defense, and Christian Banister (#4 – 2013) All-District 2nd Team Goalie.

Allen, coached by Zach Colburn, had three wins in the 2012 THSLL Season. While it was a tough year from a North District DI record perspective, Allen fought hard, and showed the competitive spirit we are used to seeing from them in every contest, regardless of the score. Allen returns fifteen Varsity players for the 2013 THSLL Season, and will look to the JV roster and incoming freshmen for a strong 2013 THSLL Season.

Coppell, coached by Alex Poole, had a successful season, with many highs, and a few bumps along the way. With such a strong 2011 class lost to graduation, a return trip to the North District DI Playoffs for the Cowboys was a season-long goal...mission accomplished.

The Coppell defense was led by seniors Zane Zoda (#55 – 2012) All-State Defense, and Logan McCullough. Between the pipes, sophomore Jonathan Ferree (#37 – 2014) All-State 2nd Team Goalie enjoyed some of the same success he experienced his freshman year when he won the 2011 THSLL State Championship, and was voted the 2011 THSLL DI State Championship Game Defensive MVP. At midfield, the Cowboys were extremely balanced, with nine players registering points throughout the season. Seniors Chase Porter, Austin Watters, Ethan Evans, and Jesse Rehling will be sorely missed next year, as will face-off specialist Matthew Ainsworth, who won 56% of his draws. On attack, Coppell was led by sophomore Nick Hruby (#10 – 2014 All-State Attack) and junior Henry Busch (All-District Honorable Mention). The attack unit gained extremely beneficial experience and built chemistry throughout the year. It will be relied upon heavily in the 2013 THSLL Season.

In 2012, the Coppell Cowboys had the opportunity to travel to Arizona to play the two best teams that state has to offer. They also had big THSLL North District DI wins over Highland Park, Southlake, and Plano West. For the 2013 THSLL Season, Coppell will return a strong nucleus of talent in hopes of improving upon a successful 2012 THSLL Season.

Episcopal School of Dallas (ESD), coached by Pat Kennedy, as always, had a strong Team, and a great 2012 THSLL Season, making it to the North District DI Playoffs, only to lose a heartbreaker to Highland Park in overtime 7-8. ESD ended its 2012 THSLL Season with an 11-4 overall record and a 5-3 District record.

With a big win over Shawnee Mission East-Kansas City 14-6, ESD finished 2012 with 12 wins and 5 losses. ESD lost those 5 games by a combined 6 goals total. The offense averaged more than 13 goals per game, and the defense allowed only 6.41 GPG. Outstanding ESD Team and individual performances resulted in three All-State Honors for ESD players – Richie Loftus (#16 – 2014) All-State Attack, Hayden Wilson (#15 – 2012) All-State Midfield, and Hunter Moore (#14 – 2012) All-State LSM, and three All-District Honors for ESD players – Barrett Anigan (#3 – 2013) All-District Midfield, Wiley Hunsaker (#21 – 2012) All-District Defense, and Wells Waller (#1 – 2012) All-District Defense.

Highland Park DI, coached by Derek Thomson, surpassed even their own expectations by earning the right to play in the North DI Super Regional Tournament with an exciting overtime win over ESD in the North District DI Playoffs. Since that hard fought victory, Highland Park DI has set new goals for themselves, and has followed up that win with victories over the Woodlands and Austin in the DI North Super Regional, earning their place in the State Championship Weekend.

Outstanding Team and individual performances resulted in two All-State Honors for Highland Park DI players – Daniel Wenz (#21 – 2013) All-State Midfield, and Domenic Massimilian (#8 – 2012) All-State FOGO, and two All-District Honors for Highland Park DI players – Wills Manley (#13 – 2013) All-District Attack, and Matthew Meaders (#25 – 2013) All-District 2nd Team Goalie.

Plano, coached by Sam Woolford, finished the 2012 THSLL Season with a 10-7 overall record and 2-6 District record. Plano was led by Hunter Gore (#5 – 2012) All-State Midfield, and Max Bagby (#9 – 2013) All-State Defense. Plano is returning 19 Varsity players, and is looking forward to a strong 2013 THSLL Season with Max leading the Wildcat defense.

Plano West, coached by Gary DeSarrano, had a great 2012 THSLL Season, with an 11-8 overall record and a 4-4 District record. The highlights of the 2012 THSLL Season were a first time win against ESD in overtime, and a big win against Coppell in the North District DI Playoffs, that earned them a place in the DI South Super Regional Tournament, where they fought hard to the final whistle before losing to Houston Christian 10-6. Plano West was led by Ryan Schaffer (#0 – 2013) All-District Attack, Daniel Kravit (2014), IV Stucker (2014), Cody DeSerrano (2013), and Freshman Goalie, Michael Douglas.





North Division II Recap

In 2012, the North District added yet another team to the ranks of Division II; Flower Mound. That makes 4 teams in the past two years that have progressed from DIII to DII. We look forward to this trend continuing over the next few years. Below is a brief recap of each team, listed in the order of their district rankings at the end of the regular season.

#1 Hillcrest (7-1) - Hillcrest finished the regular 2012 season with an 11-6 record overall, with four of those six losses to DI teams. By virtue of tiebreaker rules, the Panthers finished the regular season as the top seed for the second year running. After graduating 14 seniors last year, they will again graduate the same number in 2012. Veteran coach Bill Elliott finds a way to get the best out of his players each and every year.

#2 Flower Mound (7-1) - Flower Mound entered their inaugural DII season prepared to take on the challenge and certainly rose to the occasion. Under the direction of Coach Terry Cole, the unanimous selection by his DII North peers as district Coach of the Year, the Force was able to go 14-2 overall. With wins in both of their non-district contests against DI teams, they have their sights on the continued development of a strong lacrosse program.

#3 Keller (7-1) - In only their second season at the DII level, the Keller program improved on their record from 5-2 in district play to just one district defeat in 2012, that being to Flower Mound. With an overall record of 12-5, and a very large contingent of young talent coming up through the ranks, the Indians are building a solid foundation for the future.

#4 Highland Park (5-3) - With no seniors on the roster and only a handful of returning players, Coach Ross Thomson and his staff found a way to win when it counted. Going into the post season as the fourth seed, they were able to take all they had prepared for all season and turn it into a North District Championship. The Scots take an overall record of 11-3 into the State Playoffs with the goal of finishing off a great season on a high note.

#5 McKinney (4-4) - McKinney graduated 14 seniors from last year and found themselves with a young but dedicated team. Only six years in existence, Coach Brendan Carney saw the underclassmen take charge and show they belong. This is a program that continues to grow and is expected to play very competitive lacrosse for years to come.

#6 Greenhill (3-5) - Under the leadership of coach Kevin Barnicle, the Hornets were able to improve their record from a winless season in 2011 to 3-5 in district and to 5-11 overall. Quite an accomplishment in just one year.

#7 Plano East (2-6) - The Panthers finished with two wins in a disappointing season, but look to the future in a very positive light. The rising players and youth movement are expected to bring this program back to competitive levels in very short order.

#8 Colleyville (1-7) - Colleyville moved up from DIII in 2011 and still continue to grow. Finishing 4-14 overall, the Panthers are a developing team that displayed potential expected from this growing program.

#9 Ft. Worth Country Day (0-8) - The Falcons joined the DII in 2011 and unfortunately did not have the season they had hoped for in 2012. The winless season was not indicative of what this program has set out to accomplish, and better things are expected in the future. The local youth program is getting off the ground and is promoting lacrosse across the community. We hope to see the fruit of their labor as the sport grows.

Pioneer George Washington Glasscock, Sr. and his silent partner Thomas B. Huling donated ten acres for the town site on the condition the town be named for him, thus . . . Georgetown. In the early years, the economy of the community depended on agriculture, predominantly cotton and grains. After the Civil War, Reconstruction brought prosperity to Georgetown through four main industries - cattle, cotton, the University and the railroad.

Although the local cattle boom was relatively short-lived, it was responsible for much of Georgetown's early "rough and tumble" cowtown flavor. Because Georgetown was situated prominently along the feeder routes, which many south Texas cattle drives used, the cattle industry was always big business. A marker on the courthouse lawn in downtown Georgetown commemorates the marking of the Old Chisholm Trail, one of the most famous cattle trails.

The railroad arrived in 1878 and had a profound impact on this growing community. Fearing the consequences for the city were it not linked with the new International and Great Northern Railroad, the county's first major line, many of the town's leading citizens financed the Georgetown Tap Line. The rest of the world became accessible to Georgetown. It was now possible to obtain merchandise and supplies from all across the United States. The availability of advanced farming implements stimulated the town to become a major cotton-producing center.

Related industries, such as an oil mill and cotton gin were soon established. Other manufacturing enterprises quickly sprang up and some of these early structures can still be seen in parts of Georgetown. This new prosperity also motivated residents to forsake their log or frame dwellings for more substantial and stylish shops and homes. It was this surge of building and planning with Victorian storefronts and houses which characterized the pride, beauty and elegance of the early settlers and is still evident today in these same homes and businesses.

The Great Depression stifled the city's growth for a time, but after the Depression years, Georgetown enjoyed relative stability. The composition of the downtown commercial district and neighborhoods changed very little in subsequent years. The preservation movement in the 1970's, therefore, found "old Georgetown" essentially intact.

The community's charm and proximity to the state capitol quickly lured preservationists, new businesses, commuter residents, and retirees to settle here. Georgetown was designated a Texas Main Street City in 1982 and a plan to completely restore the downtown business district took off with a bang! Today, over \$27.5 million has been reinvested into the downtown historic area and what exists today is one of the finest collections of high style Victorian commercial architecture in the State of Texas.
